- > Student satisfactory graph shows the students feedback based on 20 questions.
- > Total number of 202 students has actively participated.
- Question number 3 got maximum point of 3.68, which is based on fairness of internal evaluation process by the teachers.
- > Question number 17 got minimum point of 3.03.
